Virtual Lesson Ideas Using EnviroScape Videos: *How Can I Be Environmentally Friendly to My Lake?*

Let's Get Virtual!

As members of lake communities that seek to educate children, teens, and adults as to what each person can do towards improving the health of our waterways, the NJ COLA Education Committee is offering resources that can be used to engage and provide stimulating educational experiences using the EnviroScape Non Point Source Model in a virtual format.

We enthusiastically offer several opportunities to let the EnviroScape model be a fun interactive star that you can post on your websites. This will allow a focus on the positive; for example, as the videos demonstrate how trees, grasses, wetlands & best management practices prevent and control water pollution in our lakes.

The three (3) EnviroScape Educational Presentations that are listed here include one from the Discover DEP - NJ Department of Environmental Protection that is approximately twenty (20) minutes in length. It highlights New Jersey concerns as presented by a NJ Watershed Ambassador for an audience of older students and adults. The second video is for younger students and shorter in length at approximately seven (7) minutes from the Heritage Conservancy in Philadelphia. There are many other extensions that can be accessed from their website that include ideas for making your own "watershed" and downloading activity handouts. Finally, the third resource is from Hamilton County, Ohio. It is directed towards all ages and is approximately twelve (12) minutes in total length.
